Introducing TLG...

Transforming Lives for Good (TLG) is a national charity that helps churches to bring hope and a future for struggling children. That means getting alongside struggling children, providing practical support in and out of school and connecting with home to bring hope and a future.

All over the UK, children are struggling in school for all kinds of reasons and many families are suffering without hope. Nationally, the latest statistics show that:

- · Children living in poverty are 4 times more likely to get a permanent exclusion from school
- More than two thirds of the current prison population were excluded from school
- One in six 16-24 year old 'NEETs' (those not in Education, Employment or Training) die within ten years of falling out of the system
- 1.5 million children are entitled to free school meals in the UK

But there is hope.

It comes through the local church making a real difference in their community. TLG is passionate about bringing a practical approach that goes way beyond education and works to build strong connections between local churches, families and schools. At TLG, we have a big vision to make the difference in as many children and families lives as possible. We are transforming lives for good!

Role Context

TLG is a national charity with a Christian ethos, enabling local churches to support struggling children and families. TLG Education Centres are innovative, independent schools delivering tailored social and educational interventions for young people. They utilise imaginative curricula and resources, passionate staff and tried and tested methods of engagement to educate young people and transform their lives.

TLG works in partnership with local churches across the UK with a heart to engage children and their families, offering them access to a supportive church community. The internship will involve working in a local church where TLG centres are based, predominantly with young people of secondary school age (11–16) who are disengaged with education. You'll be part of a team of three staff supporting up to twelve young people, blending classroom skills and relational skills together with the values of a Christian lifestyle to help deliver programmes at the centre.

You'll have access to TLG's bespoke Fast Track Leadership course, which will support your wider development as a leader as well as your understanding of Third Sector management. You will also be supported by a line manager throughout the year.

Areas of Responsibility

- Work in partnership with the Head Teacher in the planning, resourcing and delivery of innovative sessions and programmes for the young people to ensure that the centre achieves success. This may involve occasional after-school activities, including graduations, extra-curricular activities and residentials.
- Assist in team teaching, including preparation and/or leading of sessions when directed by the Head Teacher.
- Share in identifying individual development needs of students and establishing Individual Educational Plans to appropriately meet these needs.
- Develop mentoring relationships with young people, in order to support their development.
- Work within the team to tackle issues such as: behaviour for learning, child protection, substance abuse intervention and other social issues that prevent whole person development.
- Support senior staff to ensure the suitability of the environment, facilities and premises in line with centre support guidelines.
- Support the centre team with administration of records and monitoring outcomes as required.

- Represent TLG in communication with parents and external agencies as required.
- Support opportunities for young people to explore the Christian faith, possibly in partnership with the centre's partner church.
- Participate fully in personal and team development opportunities including training delivered as part of The Fast Track Intern Programme, staff conferences, professional training, and staff meetings.
- Attend, fully participate in and, on occasions, lead daily Christian devotionals and times of worship for the staff team.
- Be aware of the opportunity to participate in residential trips, involving children from the projects that TLG are a part of.
