Vacancy for Head Teacher from September 2020

Head Teacher Job Description

In general, he/she will be:

1. A Christian of good character, held in esteem
2. Committed to the historical, evangelical, protestant faith
3. Experienced in Christian service
4. A valued member of an evangelical church
5. Committed to our Statement of Faith
6. Committed to developing the Christian ethos of the school in adherence to the historical, evangelical, protestant faith
7. Willing to meet regularly with the Spiritual Oversight Committee and accept their guidance on spiritual matters to do with the Christian position of the school

In particular, as Head Teacher, he/she will be expected to:

1. Lead the school with vision, expertise and enthusiasm creating an ethos which recognises the personal worth of the individual
2. Set a good example in professional standards
3. Foster good relationships within the whole school family of children, staff, parents, Governors and supporters
4. Have an overall view of the school which ensures continuity and consistency in all areas of school life
5. Monitor and evaluate the quality of learning and teaching within the school
6. Review all school policies and curriculum matters regularly with staff and Governors to ensure relevance and compliance with the principles and aims of the school



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7. Make appropriate provision for children with special educational needs
8. Look for opportunities to extend the influence of the school into the wider community
9. As far as possible ensure the safety and well-being of children, staff and visitors through the implementation of a Health and Safety Policy and a Policy for the Safeguarding of Children
10. Play a significant role with Governors, and following discussions with staff, in allocating funds available to purchase resources for the school
11. Keep the Governors informed of the school's needs in the areas of personnel and premises
12. Deal with requests made by parents for their children to be admitted to the school.
13. Take opportunities as appropriate for further personal professional development and encourage members of the teaching staff to do this.
14. Keep abreast of any Government initiatives which will have a bearing on school policies
15. Liaise, when and where necessary, with agencies such as the DFE and Ofsted
16. Teach approximately a 50% timetable

In particular, as a class teacher, he/she will be required to:

1. Create a safe, stimulating and challenging learning environment
2. Plan, prepare and teach the curriculum, matching learning tasks to the age, aptitude and ability of the individual child
3. Assess, record and report on the progress and attainment of the children
4. Establish and maintain good order and discipline ensuring the safety and well-being of the children
5. Encourage the children in their development of good relationships with other children and adults
6. Use his / her strengths to the benefit of the whole school community
7. Provide advice and support to parents concerning their children
