



Role Description - Modern Slavery programme

Role: Support Volunteer (reception, room host, refreshments, help desk or crèche staff)

Location: Nottingham based

Accountable to: Abi Pitt, Local Programme Coordinator

Summary of tasks

- To help create a friendly and supportive environment for clients
- To assist in organising group education sessions
- Work as a team to demonstrate healthy relationships in an inclusive environment
- Help people get to know their local city area and services available
- To get to know clients through a mix of social and structured sessions
- Signpost clients to helpful resources
- Introduce clients to specialised services during the session (eg job seeking, debt advice etc)
- To be able to offer specific volunteer duties around one or more of the following roles:
 - **Reception:** Warmly welcome clients and help them feel at ease, sign people in and out, record clients details
 - **Refreshments:** Prepare and serve tea, coffee, refreshments and light food options for clients
 - **Room Host:** to organise, host and facilitate weekly activities (based on group needs)
 - **Help Desk:** to help clients access general community advice or services online (eg, job seeking, application forms, general online advice, printing information needed etc) and facilitate the use of laptops if needed
 - **Crèche staff:** to provide childcare for children accessing the facilities, including organising session materials

Skills/experience needed

- Interest in The Salvation Army's modern slavery work and sympathy with the general aims and values of The Salvation Army
- Sensitive interpersonal and social skills
- Ability to keep confidences
- Commitment to safeguarding and a willingness to raise concerns where necessary
- Experience of working in a team
- Be able to support clients navigating new situations
- Be able to create a friendly, warm environment and help people feel at ease

Training provided

- Specialised volunteer, group support and safeguarding training from The Salvation Army's Anti-Trafficking and Modern Slavery Unit (approx. 10 hours spread over 2 separate sessions)
- Relevant online courses via The Salvation Army online portal (self-managed e-learning, approx. 8 hours over the 12-month period)
