This vacancy has become available at a key time for Kidz Klub Leeds as we build on the past 20 years of ministry and prepare for the coming 10. This is a crucial role, working alongside the Fundraising and Leadership Team to deliver the Fundraising Strategy for Kidz Klub Leeds. The post holder will focus on fundraising across all income streams through; events, legacies, regular and major donors and trusts as well as seeking to expand these and find new sources of income alongside the Fundraising Team.

Enclosed you will find an application form and further information about Kidz Klub Leeds. As well as a completed application form please submit a fundraising strategy for how you would raise funds for Kidz Klub Leeds. This should be no more than four pages long and you will be asked to present this if you are invited to interview.

The nature of the work of the charity means any offer of employment will be subject to a completed enhanced DBS check and references. This will be done in line with our Child Protection, Screening and Recruitment of Ex Offenders Policies.

Whilst the post holder does not need to be a practicing Christian, it is a genuine requirement of the post that the post holder wholeheartedly supports the vision and values of the charity and can articulate those well in representing the charity. As a Christian charity a central aspect of all we do is a rhythm of prayer and reflection which the post holder will be welcome to be involved in. This informs all of our strategic plans and underpins all of our fundraising efforts.

This is a full time position, however less hours or term time only hours may be considered for the right candidate. Please include this in your application if this is something you would like us to consider.

The deadline for completed applications is **9am Weds 4th March**. Interviews for shortlisted candidates will take place on **Tues 10th or Weds 11th March**. Kidz Klub Leeds

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Vision

Lasting transformation through the love of God for our cities most vulnerable children, their families and communities.

What we do

Kidz Klub Leeds is a Christian children's charity, working with over 1,000 children aged 4-11 years each week living in the inner city and outer estate communities of Leeds. Our dual aims are to enable these children to grow up into mature young adults with positive aspirations for themselves and their communities, and to pass on a passionate, living and empowering Christian message of faith, hope and love. Kidz Klub is supported by churches, over 80 dedicated volunteers, regular givers, prayer supporters and corporate supporters.

How we do it

Kidz Klub works through four streams:

Kidz Klub Sessions- Central Klub and Hub Klub's

Central Klub operates for all of our children, with 7 double decker buses collecting the children. Fast paced, fun, loud, colourful and creative-Central Klub involves 20 minutes of sung praise, 20 minutes of messy and outrageous games and 20 minutes of teaching, including a bible lesson, object lessons and a chance for the children to respond to what they have heard. Our vision is to reach more children growing up in poverty in the city through the expansion of this Kidz Klub session with more buses.

We are currently rolling out Hub Klub's on the ground in Beeston, Holbeck, Middleton and Bramley. Still engaging and fun-these are intentionally quieter and smaller groups, with children progressing through age groups and having time to talk. There is a focus on discipleship, prayer and the children being the community changers as they plan local mission and social action evets they want to run and we help them to make it happen once every six weeks.

- Home visiting

Each week over 900 children are visited at home by a team of around 50 volunteers. The Kidz Klubs give great context for the visits, but it is at the children's homes where the relationships are built that lead to the wonderful changes we see in the children's lives. Home visitors are mentors, friends, parent and older sibling figures, who often provide great support to the families as a whole as well as the children. The home visitors take with them to give to the children colouring sheets designed in the Kidz Klub office with details of the upcoming Kidz Klub.

- Community and Family Support Work

Kidz Klub Leeds supports our most vulnerable families through bespoke family support work, which often sees us working with other agencies, charities and churches. We also run many smaller projects throughout the week and on an ad hoc basis. These projects are a means to go deeper into communities, and help Kidz Klub to listen to families and provide activities that are needed. Present activities include regular small trips, larger family trips, community parties, annual camps and a café for parents. Kidz Klub are often presented with opportunities to expand our community work and have plans to do so with relevant funding in place.

- Schools Work

Our schools team deliver assemblies and lunch clubs in 34 inner city primary schools each year, covering a diverse range of topics including 'small actions can cause big changes', 'looking after our environment' and bullying. Kidz Klub assemblies are extremely popular with schools and pupils, and are crucial in fostering relationships with schools, keeping Kidz Klub embedded in communities and a means of children finding out about their local Kidz Klubs. We have many opportunities to develop our schools work and plan to do this alongside a growing fundraising strategy in the next 10 years.

- Young Leaders


As the children move to high school they are supported into youth groups and invited back as young leaders, where they develop skills for work, receive ongoing support and mentoring and continue to be part of an intergenerational team.

- Kidz Klub Academy

We run an accredited training and work experience program for 16+ NEET's, often supporting Kidz Klub Mum's through the academy. We support people to grow in confidence, gain qualifications and make the next step into education or employment.

Turnover and funding

Our current annual budget is set at £313,320.15 of which £146,306.21 is our target fundraising figure after guaranteed funds. This is set to grow over the coming years in line with our 10 year strategic plan.
