Mercy Ships uses hospital ships to transform lives and serve nations

Mercy ships delivers free surgical care onboard state of the art hospital ships. Serving people who would have no other way to receive help.

As well as providing direct medical care, Mercy Ships also train and mentor healthcare professionals, renovate hospitals and clinics, and work with governments to build sustainable national healthcare plans.

Volunteer onboard

Our hospital ships are run almost entirely by volunteers and have around 400 crew onboard. The ships carry the hospital, crew accommodation, dining room, café, school, library and offices.

We usually stay docked in a host nation for 10 months. Crew can leave the ship to explore the city or get involved with Mercy Ships programmes based off the ship, like the HOPE Centre.

We have crew from more than 40 different nations every year, making a vibrant, faith-based community that thrives on loving and serving one another and the patients who trust us to care for them.

Every crew member makes a difference and every role is crucial.





Just half of the positions onboard are medical

We don't just need doctors and nurses. Half of the positions onboard are in our technical or general departments. We're a ship, so we need marine deck and engineering crew. These volunteers fuel the work in the hospital and sail us to each destination.

And we also need support staff onboard the ship who play vital roles - feeding everyone, keeping our IT equipment running, keeping our vehicles going, taking photos or teaching in the school.

Couples & Families

One fantastic thing about serving with Mercy Ships is that spouses can serve together and families can live together onboard.

Couples simply need to find a role that suits each of them; and if a family member takes on a leadership role in any department, they can bring their family too!

The school is fully accredited and you get a cabin just for your family. Couples get their own cabin too.
