At Abernethy, we believe that shared adventures in the outdoors create incomparable opportunities to transform lives. We've been providing adventure residential experiences for nearly 50 years and through hospitality and adventure, we equip our guests with relationships, experiences, and character that will arm them for life.

About the School

The flow of nature, the natural elements of sun, wind and rain all contribute to the adventure of journeying in the outdoors: but somewhere out there, we grow in faith, discover more of God and creation and become more like Him.

Here at Abernethy, we intend our School of Adventure Leadership to train students in both soft and hard skills, becoming disciplined in adventure and equipped in God's word, using the outdoors as the context in which to share the gospel. Our twelve month, full-time residential course will allow you to go deep into God's word, His character, and our identity in Christ, alongside NGB qualifications, and learn how to lead groups in the outdoors.

Previously located at Abernethy Ardgour, the School of Adventure Leadership will now be at Abernethy Nethybridge, our Highland base in the stunning Cairngorm National Park which offers an abundance of adventures.

Our School of Adventure Leadership is divided into **four key areas**. During the year, our team and guests also join in parts of the school, and we share **biblical hospitality and fellowship** together.



Director for the Solas Centre of Public Christianity


