Job Summary

Video has become a primary channel for Open Doors in communicating the stories of the persecuted church, and demand for video content continues to increase significantly. It is a key part of our future communications strategy and aligns strongly with the expectations of our ever-growing supporter base. You'll be creating bespoke content and increasing our ability to tell better stories to help grow supporter commitment, prayer, giving and speaking out.

Key Responsibilities

You will enable our team to respond to the growing demand for video content, respond quickly to projects with a short lead time and enable Open Doors to continue to grow into areas where video content has the greatest impact. As Junior Video Editor you will:

 Be responsible for day-to-day video editing, primarily for social media channels and sharing on digital platforms
 - Contribute original ideas and assist the Creative Design Manager in the development of the use of AV
 - Manage mid-level video projects throughout the creative process, from idea to completion
 - Be responsible for filming and editing in-house video requests
 - Maintain the consistency, quality and branding of our video productions
 - Explore and monitor content added to Open Doors intranet by partners who work directly with persecuted believers, and advise the Content team in the selection of inspiring stories to build engaging content
 - Be responsible for managing content on the Open Doors UK video channels (Vimeo and YouTube)
 - Ensure AV content is well organised and stored so that we maintain a good catalogue of content

Applying your Christian Faith to This Role:

- Applying biblical principles of godly stewardship to operational responsibilities
- To be open and obedient to God's voice and direction in relation to any strategic matter and to always seek His will above all else
- An openness to the prompting of the Holy Spirit
