

of God's faithfulness

If you'd told us back in 2014 we'd see 55 baptisms, train 26 interns, send 12 people into set-apart ministry, plant a church and facilitate another six church plants, all by 2024, I don't think we'd have believed you. But God does 'immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine' (Ephesians 3:20). When we planted City Church, we had plans of what it might look like. But what God has done over the last decade is so different, and so much better. It's a reminder of Isaiah 55:9 - that God's ways are higher than our ways and his thoughts higher than our thoughts.

Today, City Church is larger and more diverse than it's ever been. But we face big challenges as we temporarily move venues and add a third service. These are also incredible opportunities - to reach new people and impact new communities, to grow deeper in faith and to persevere in prayer. No one knew what our first ten years would be like, and no one knows what the next ten will bring either. That is, no one except God. And his plans and purposes are always good. So let's lean into him in prayer; pursuing intimacy, dependence and expectancy together, seeking our God who can 'do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us.'

This year it's really encouraging to see how our church is growing in financial stewardship to give sacrificially. One person noted how they found the Weekend Away seminar on stewardship 'life changing.' We are also growing in our time stewardship – every time a church partner visits, they are deeply encouraged and surprised by the number of people serving on a Sunday.

We might feel that church in a box (setting up and setting down each Sunday) is a difficult burden, but our church partners help us see it as a blessing because it encourages more of us to serve, and therefore experience the joy of working together in service to God.

Being a city centre church means a certain level of transience – people stay for an average of three years. We're so grateful for how quickly most get stuck in and are a great blessing while they are here. It's always hard to say goodbye but it helps us remember that we are but sojourners in a foreign land – and it won't be until the new creation that we'll all finally settle down for good!

They've both been incredibly hard workers, wonderful brothers in Christ and will be greatly missed. We're delighted that William Merritt will continue as a second-year intern, focusing more on the New to the UK ministry. We're working on recruiting a great team of interns and may end up with a strong team of six – the biggest team yet and an exciting time for our internship program. God is moving in our student ministry. Though gospel fruit is not truly measured by statistics, each number represents a soul cherished by a saviour who longs for a relationship with them. Almost all the new students who came to the October Weekend Away are now integral parts of our community – they've grown in Christ so much already! It's great to see many of our students stepping up into serving, committing their lives to Christ and to the church through baptism (seven of our students were baptised this year and three became members). We're also now meeting weekly to pray for the city, the world and our friends; we eat together before Equip to connect and bond; we meet monthly for a Bible study social; and we've just completed our first 6-week early morning female discipleship group.

Please pray more students live radically for Jesus while at uni and that they'd benefit from our encouragement as we cheer them on to serve, connect with others, learn from what's on offer here at City Church, and ultimately grow in love for Jesus.






youth

Another year and another venue for our youth! We decided to shift our meetings to Central Hall to be more accessible – and a new family has joined since we made the move to the city centre. It's so encouraging to see how the families are serving one another by sharing lifts and helping each other. It's great seeing a broader age range than ever before (11-18), but it's also challenging to make sure we're discipling all our young people in an age-appropriate way.

We've launched a new small group structure during our sessions to help us better apply the gospel and answer questions. We now have 5 young people meeting one-to-one regularly with a youth team member. We've had ice skating and climbing socials and studied Ecclesiastes and Colossians. This summer, we're studying some basic doctrines and we're excited to have our first graduate – Annabel Amadin – who's turned 18 this year!





Youth is now the highlight of my week. Seeing over time how we've grown so close is such a blessing to see. I loved our Ecclesiastes series – teaching us not to set our eyes on the world but find our forever meaning in Christ.

Connect is going well and as we look to transitioning to meeting weekly, starting some more groups and phasing out year-round Equip for the time being, we're encouraged to see more people being willing to step up and be trained to lead and host groups in their homes.

continued growth

We continue to welcome many new people each week, many of whom are exploring Christianity either for the first time or after a long hiatus away from church and spiritual practice. We run regular seeker courses for those at that stage in their journey, but primarily believe that belonging to a Christian community is a great way to see faith lived out. We have also sought to have 1,000 evangelistic drinks with non-Christian friends, colleagues and neighbours.

The pizza place we go to after the 6:30 service (A Place Called Common) is one of the best places for those who have questions to have an informal chat and explore more about who Jesus is in an organic way. There are a growing number of Iranians coming regularly who have forsaken Islam and considering Christianity instead, at great potential cost to themselves. It was a huge blessing to baptise two of them along with twelve others who have committed their lives to Christ.

We had a record-breaking 613 people come to our Christmas services and donated hampers and gifts to local care homes. It was a joy to wrap and deliver these gifts – hopefully the start of an ongoing ministry to these care homes, in partnership with Silver Cord Ministries.

Our club is the UK's largest Christian-run football club – 3 men's teams, one in each of the three South Manchester and Cheshire Christian Football League (SMCCFL) divisions. Athletic (first team) and United (third team) are in the running for the top 2 in their respective divisions. We reached the quarter final (last 8) of the National Christian Cup, and the final of the Manchester Churches Trophy.

Shared passion for playing football brings together demographics and nationalities – resulting in a massive gospel opportunity as only 20% of players are Christians. We hear stories of friendships developing and guys opening up their lives – sharing meals, going to the pub, and watching sports. One pair went to London together for the fun! We aim to be more than a sports team – encouraging our Christian players to share Christ with other players and teammates.

men & women growing in Christ

It's been such a blessing to see the growth of our women through early morning book clubs, walks through the Peak District, and late night Bible studies. We joined with Redeemer and Trinity Churches to run a Women's Conference – 90 women from around Manchester attended! We've launched Bible study groups that meet to dig into God's Word together. Our goal is to study 3 books of the Bible each year. We also have two men's discipleship groups. One focuses on raising up new preachers who then preach at other churches needing support. The other group meets early morning to study Scripture – so far, covering Romans & Ephesians.

We're getting to know each other, encouraged and equipped by the Word of God to testify of his great love wherever we are in Manchester. Our hope and prayer is to continue to steward the opportunities God provides for our growth and faith.

What a blessing to now have 45 or so different nationalities represented here at City Church. Since September, our team organised events such as Board Games Club, Hotpot Night, and Come Dine with Me at church members' homes. We've just launched a weekly English Conversation Club, meeting on Sundays before the first service.

We partner with Friends International – church members host and welcome international students to share a meal or serve at iCafe, a space to befriend and share the good news of Jesus with international students.

To help those with English as a second language, we make sure Bibles in other languages and a sermon transcript is available each week. It's wonderful to have a small glimpse of heaven – where one day people from every nation, tribe and language gather to worship the Lord together!



mission

in Manchester, the Northwest & beyond

A big part of our DNA is to support more church planting so more can hear the life-changing gospel and access the whole-life care the church provides.

Thanks to God's generosity towards us, we can release our pastors, Matt & Ralph to play a big part in three global church planting initiatives – regularly coaching other leaders, speaking at conferences and running training events across the world. They also coach and host training and collectives for local leaders and church planters here in Manchester.

We recognise more than just training and coaching is needed! So we give 13% of our finances to supporting church planting – in line with our vision to be a hub church resourcing others. This provides salaries, building funds, and training grants for church planters and their teams at CPC Fairfield, Redeemer and Crossroads Church in Dubai, Big City Church Kyiv, and Miner's Place Lagos. We also contribute to local networks – City to City Europe, Northern Gospel Project, UCCF (UK student ministry) and FIEC (the Fellowship of Independent Evangelical Churches we're part of). Praise God for unity, friendship and the opportunity to share resources!





goals

Every year, we set a measurable goal to help move the needle on our ten-year vision. We're still committed to planting another church by 2027 if God wills, but we're also committed to helping our church grow and thrive during our time out of Central Hall. The elders came back from their getaway with the following goal:

As the Lord leads us into a season of change starting in September 2024, we want to pursue intimacy, dependance and expectation through gathered prayer.

Our primary aim is to –

- **Encourage 60% members regularly attending new monthly prayer gatherings**

Additionally we aim to –

- **Start a third morning service**
- **Spend more time in organic, informal fellowship through weekly Connect, church lunches, and more**
- **Grow in our giving by £25-50/month per giving unit to cover the cost of a new venue & a third service**
- **Grow our serving teams by another 30 people to facilitate a third service**
- **Grow another 5 Connect groups**
